IMPROVING TRAFALGAR ROAD PARK

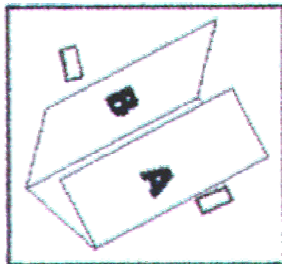

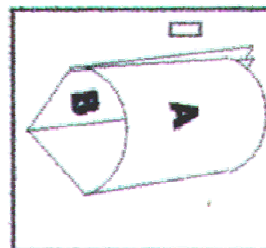
