DOORSTEP RECYCLING TO BE EXTENDED THIS OCTOBER

The present doorstep recycling scheme in Kings Heath is to be extended to cover north Moseley, starting the fortnight of 16th October. North Moseley being the area north of Wake Green Road and east of Alcester Road. The scheme will be extended to cover the rest of Moseley in April 2007. The doorstep collection will recycle plastics, metals and glass.

By April 2008 all households in Birmingham will have a doorstep collection for compost, plastics, metals and glass.

In the municipal year 2003/4 - the final year of the Labour administration - the amount of waste recycled was 12.83%. At the moment 17% of waste is recycled. By 2010, the Council plans to recycle 30% of household waste - excluding incinerated waste.
